



CARY PARK DISTRICT PRESCHOOL DISCIPLINE GUIDELINES - 2020/2021 SCHOOL YEAR

Preschool participants are expected to always exhibit appropriate behavior. As with any large group of children, rules of discipline must be enforced by Cary Park District Staff. We ask that you, as parents, go over this information with your child so they are aware of the consequences of unacceptable behavior. Below is a list of *some* common unacceptable behavior that will not be tolerated.

A caring and positive approach will be taken regarding behavior management and discipline. We hope to help children develop self-control and responsibility for their actions. Teachers will be firm and consistent in their approach and will establish simple, understandable rules:

- We do not hurt ourselves.
- We do not hurt others.
- We do not hurt things around us.

Children will be encouraged to “use their words” to resolve conflicts or they may be redirected to alternate activities. If a child has difficulty managing his/her behavior on a recurring basis, parents will be asked to meet with the child’s teachers and Preschool Director. If the child’s behavior continues to be inappropriate, consistently disruptive and/or dangerous, the child may be removed from the program.

*** Cary Park District reserves the right to immediately suspend or expel any child whose actions are seen as detrimental to the Preschool program. Each situation will be evaluated on its own merit. Preschool staff may develop additional rules as necessary.
